Pursuant to RSA 228:99 and RSA 240, the Governor's Advisory Commission on Intermodal Transportation (GACIT), (which is composed of the five Executive Councilors and the Commissioner of the New Hampshire Department of Transportation), announces that Public Hearings will be held to review and receive input on the Department of Transportation's recommended update of the State's Ten Year Transportation Improvement Plan (2009-2018).
